- Understand how neurodevelopmental functions interact either to facilitate or to impair learning and interpersonal behaviours,
- Learn methods with which to identify neurodevelopmental systems that require therapeutic intervention, and
- Recognise factors involved in processing sensory input in order for a response to occur.



Learning Outcomes:

- Brief overview of the brain, the nervous systems, and the cranial nerves;
- Sensory-Motor Interdependency and Interaction chart;
- The sensory-motor systems: how each system works, and how they work together and support each other;
- How it looks when these systems are disrupted, disorganised or inefficient;
- The hierarchical processing modalities of the brain, and how it looks when these aren't functioning efficiently;
- The factors involved in processing sensory input in order for a response to occur; and
- HANDLE activities to enhance learning, functioning, and efficiency and how to adapt them to varying abilities and situations.
